

Kelly Tough, by Erin Kelly

You know you have a "good read" in your hands when, after finishing the book, you discover that 50% of the pages have been smothered in highlighter and the remaining pages are ear-marked and blessed with hand-written pencil notations! One such book for me was Kelly Tough, by Erin Kelly (daughter of Buffalo Bills quarterback Jim Kelly).
